

## CLOTHING & EQUIPMENT LIST

Camp is rough on clothes and gear. Items that are older and less expensive are recommended. We ask that campers wear shoes at all times. This is to avoid cuts and slivers in the feet and to make walking, hiking and running more **safe** and enjoyable. Please help us by leaving sandals and flimsy shoes at home. Flip-flops are permissible in showers only! ***Clothing should be appropriate for a church camp: modest in fit and without inappropriate words or messages.***

***Camp policies prohibit campers from using or possessing tobacco products, alcoholic beverages, non-prescribed drugs or weapons at camp.***

### CLOTHING (*in addition to what camper wears to camp*)

1-2 pair of light-weight long pants*	1-2 modest swimsuits ( <b>no string bikinis</b> )
4-7 pairs of shorts	1 pair of sturdy shoes for hiking
2 long sleeved shirts	2 extra pairs of tennis shoes/water shoes that can get wet ( <b>no sandals or flip-flops</b> )
6 T-shirts	1 hooded sweatshirt or sweater
6 <b>sets</b> of underwear	1 rain jacket or poncho ( <b>no umbrellas</b> )
7 pairs of socks	
1 pair pajamas	

\*Long pants are needed for participation on the group initiative and cook-outs.

### BEDDING

sleeping bag or bedding for bunk, small pillow and pillow case (optional)  
sheet - for those hot nights and to provide protection from mosquitoes

### ALSO NEEDED

√Bible	notebook and pencils
√offering money	flashlight & extra batteries
√water bottle	insect repellent
lip balm	2 towels & wash cloths
comb or brush	dirty clothes bag
sun screen	necessary medications - <b>in original container</b>
wash kit (toothpaste/brush, soap, shampoo, deodorant....)	

### OPTIONAL

sun hat & sun glasses	pencil/pen, paper, stamped envelopes
camera & film	fishing pole & tackle, ball glove
day pack	musical instrument - guitar, banjo, flute, etc.

**DO NOT BRING: valuables, knives, radios, cassette/disc players, electronic games, food items, magazines, comic books, firecrackers, hair dryers/curling irons, matches/lighters.**

### LOST & FOUND IS A CONSTANT CONCERN FOR CAMP STAFF. PLEASE HELP US.

1. Mark everything, including suitcases/duffle bags, with the camper's full last name.
2. Roll your sleeping bag or bedding tightly with a sturdy tie or belt. Stuff bags are great.
3. Every camper will carry, care for and be responsible for his/her own gear
4. The camp management is not responsible for lost, stolen or damaged items.
