This is our first full year living in Nacala and we have been focusing mostly on building relationships in the community. We live and serve in one particular area a lot and we are trying to get to know the people and represent Jesus to them as well as we can.

Our days are still filled with a lot of construction at the new Iris center. We share Jesus with our mostly Muslim construction crew everyday. (see picture) They are our new friends and neighbors and we want them to know that the purpose behind all the construction is Jesus. In November, we will be hosting Iris Global's International



School of Missions for a month so we must finish the majority of the construction project by mid-October. We are so excited to host them and help train a new generation of missionaries!

In July and August, the Iris well drilling team will be coming to drill 25 wells in the most desperate areas in Nacala. Thank you all for your prayers and support. We truly appreciate it.

#### Summer Update

The youth of St. Paul's have been active and are doing well. We met about every two weeks and had two noteworthy outings - a float trip on the Black River (picture on left) and a Lake Weekend at Bull Shoals Lake (pictures below).

Throughout this summer we studied topics from a book called "10 Questions Every Teen Should Ask (and Answer) about Christianity" by Rebecca McLaughlin. The 10 chapters cover very relevant topics that we all face especially in a post Christian world. Every student received a copy of this book for reference in the future. Rebecca McLaughlin also authored an adult targeted book similar to this one called "Confronting Christianity – 12 Hard Questions for the World's Largest Religion" that is a recommend read for anyone interested.

Although Summer is a bit sketchy on attendance as vacations, sports, and other family activities often overlap, we had 9 students attend the Lake Weekend event and discussed 4 of the chapters from our 10 Questions book. The Saturday of Lake Weekend was dedicated to tubing, swimming, and waterskiing. We happily came back with no injuries and only minor sunburns. During the weekend we began to feel like a youth group and less like a group of youths. That is a great step to build the fall season on and we hope we can build on those relationships. Of note, our youth program has 12 active students who often bring friends. We have gotten to know the students better and can attest that this is a great group of people.

Finally, we had to say goodbye to Isabella del Cid as she has to finish her last year at UMKC. She has been an awesome leader this summer and will be missed.

Since that day in 2005, 542 knitted and crocheted items (shawls, lap robes, and baby blankets) have been lovingly gifted.
