

Those of us who are followers can turn to the Lion of the Tribe of Judah, the Root of David. He has conquered. He is worthy to bring about God's saving plan for the world. When you feel powerless, that's when you can turn to him. He wants to take people who are powerless and turn them into people who will reign with him!

MISSOURI PRO-CHOICE AMMENDMENT

A group known as "The Missourians for Constitutional Freedom" is currently circulating a petition to collect signatures for the "Missouri Right to Reproductive Freedom Amendment (2024)." They are attempting to get this constitutional amendment on the ballot for November 5, 2024. The deadline to submit the required number of signatures is May 5th.

Signature collectors may tell you that the amendment is about women's health or reproductive rights. Please be aware that this amendment, if passed, will eliminate the current restrictions on abortion in the State of Missouri and limit the general assembly's ability to regulate abortion only after "fetal viability." The amendment defines fetal viability as "the point in pregnancy when, in the good faith judgment of a treating health care professional and based on the particular facts of the case, there is a significant likelihood of the fetus's sustained survival outside the uterus without the application of extraordinary medical measures." There are several phrases in this definition which are open to a wide degree of interpretation.

This amendment will remove the hard-won protections for the unborn in Missouri. We can support life by refusing to sign this petition. We can support pregnant women and mothers in crisis in a wide variety of ways. YOUTH MISSION TRIP

St. Paul's Youth will be sending 10 youth and 3 adults to Maumee, Ohio, near Cleveland, for a Group mission trip from June 16 - 22.



At Group work camps, hundreds of teenagers from youth groups across the country repair and transform homes while deepening their faith and building new relationships with their peers and youth leaders. Home repair mission trips are mid-sized gatherings with up to 400 teenage participants that focus specifically on residential home repair. Home repair projects range from painting to building decks and wheelchair ramps, and other general home repairs. But, the service projects are often secondary to the spiritual growth that happens when students step out on their own and serve those in need. Beyond the physical transformation that happens in the served communities, teenagers bring the hope and light of Jesus to the residents they serve.



Group has been planning work camps for youth for 30+ years. St. Paul's has participated in the past (see picture) in Group work camps. Our experiences have always been great with students getting the opportunity to blossom with new friends in new environments, reaching outside of their comfort zones.

During work camp, we will stay at a local school that is full of fun and energy as we interact, share meals together, and participate in worship and teaching in morning and evening programs. Each work camp has a strong Gospel message component that is discussed at four different periods throughout the day.

This year's program theme is "Influencer." We're all influenced and influencers to others through interactions, news, music, work, school, sports and anywhere we focus our attention. Whether we think so or not, everyone is an influencer. Everything we do is seen and watched by our friends, family, peers, and others around us. We make an impression and have real influence. The goal this year is to help students navigate the many influences in their lives and encourage them to look toward Jesus to positively change our culture. Romans 12:2 reminds us: *Do not conform to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will.*

St. Paul's is being asked to take a gift along to support the community after we have gone. They have asked us to supply diapers and/or home paper products to be given to families in need in Maumee. We will have a collection box in the Welcome Center starting mid-May for anyone who would care to donate.
