NEWS FROM THE ELDER MEETING

<u>Outreach to our Community</u> - The Elders are preparing a mailing to families within one mile of the church at the end of August. This outreach will introduce the Church and new Pastor and provide a brief description of our programs and an invitation to visit and worship with us.

A <u>computer tracking system</u> is in place for the visitation and contacting our shut-in members. The Elders will take the lead for these contacts.

The Elders discussed **security and safety** at the church. Ideas were discussed and hopefully necessary systems can be put in place.

Nominating Committee - A committee is being formed and will start to select and interview candidates to recommend to the congregation to be elected to serve beginning in 2025.

<u>Elder Prayer Time</u> - We urge you to join the Elders on the last Saturday of each month at the church for a time of prayer for the church, community and nation.

NEW LEGACY FUND PRESENTED AT TOWN HALL MEETING

We are pleased to introduce the St. Paul's Evangelical Church Legacy Fund. Much like an academic endowment, the Fund creates an opportunity for donors to make an impact for God's Kingdom in ways not previously attainable. It will also give donors the opportunity to leave a significant legacy as they play a role in advancing God's Kingdom.

The purpose of the Legacy Fund is to amplify and expand the core commitments of the mission and vision of St. Paul's Evangelical Church beyond its ordinary, annual capacity. The Fund provides a landing place for future surplus funds, while also enabling donors to contribute aboveand-beyond their normal giving to the church, including estate planning and other higher-end generosity endeavors. Its primary purpose is not to support general operating expenses.

Generally, 8% of the Legacy Fund balance will be distributed among these three funds annually.

- The New Initiatives Fund designed primarily for enhancing St. Paul's facilities.
- **The Intern Fund** designed for short-term support to provide training and mentorship in professional ministry. The intent is to release individuals for ministry in the broader kingdom.
- **The Kingdom Fund** designed for new ministries or to enhance existing ministries to advance God's Kingdom in St. Louis and to the ends of the earth.

WHO'S GOING TO BE LEADING WORSHIP NOW?

St. Paul's has formed a search committee to fill a worship director position that would oversee traditional and contemporary worship which includes the choir, praise band, handbells, sound, and tech. We are thankful for Craig Caesar stepping in as interim worship leader and for Bill Sullivan continuing to serve as our organist/pianist. The search team, led by Craig Caesar, includes Pastor Marc, David Brewer, Carter Meier, Kim Paquette and Susan Pollmann. In the interim, it is Pastor Marc's desire that the choir meet as normal on Thursday nights, beginning on September 5th, and share anthems during worship. The Search Team will look for an interim director to fill in until we hire someone permanently. Join us in prayer for this search and for wisdom and guidance for the search committee.

The All Nations training was a reminder that God is bringing the nations to us, and we need to be God's image-bearers to them. What does that look like? Lots of options, certainly including awareness and engagement with the diversity around us, befriending those God places in our paths, spending time together, and being curious about their home countries and their beliefs. It might even mean eating food that doesn't taste like anything we have ever tasted before. The study guide reminded us that God has always had a heart for all nations. He promised Abraham that "in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed," (Genesis 12:3) and John described a Supper in heaven as including "a great multitude that no one could number from every nation, from all tribes and peoples and languages." (Revelations 7:9) There is no one Jesus does not care about.

St. Paul's, especially, is situated in an area of growing diversity, and we are looking for ways to reach out to our neighbors – things as obvious as including a flyer about the church in every bag of purchases at the rummage sale and holding our church picnic in a community park – and things we haven't yet thought of. What suggestions do you have? We want to hear them! Please share your thoughts with Pastor Marc or the Outreach Team (David Pollmann, Donna Triebe and Susan Musselmann), and please be prepared to help implement any of your suggestions. Let's pray together that God will show us how to bless the nations just beyond our doors.

"Love for God fuels our love for neighbor." What a great reminder from this training. In order to do this we abide in the love of God and ask him to show us his love for our neighbors. All Nations is looking to develop teams in every zip code in St Louis to reach the nations. What a blessing to see 14 churches represented during this training hosted by St. Paul's. We were also scheduled to have Craig and LaDonna Smith of Christian & Missionary Alliance on July 7, but the generator on their RV went out and for health reasons they could not remain in St. Louis. We are so very grateful that all of these missionaries took time out of their busy schedules to be with us and help St. Paul's reconfirm our commitment to the Great Commission.

On August 11, we were visited by Mark and Mary Esther Penner, who for many years have been working to translate the Bible into Japanese sign language. They were joined by two of the Japanese ladies directly involved in this translation.

Ms. Uiko Yano is a deaf lady who shared her testimony and holds the position of project director. Ms. Sora Adachi is the exegetical consultant who is now working on Hebrews. Please pray for these two women as they return to Japan to continue with this translation. To date, approximately onethird of the Bible has been translated and this has taken about thirty years. They hope the remaining two-thirds will be completed in another 20-30 years.





On Sunday, August 18, we had the privilege of hearing from Jonathan Friz as he gave an update on 10 Days of Prayer, as well as how this ministry of prayer is spreading world-wide. Jonathan was accompanied by two of his children, Phineas and Eva.
