Even when Paul the Apostle was shackled in a cold Roman prison, he said "Sing and make music in your heart to the Lord, always giving thanks to God the Father for everything, in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ" (Ephesians 5:19-20, NIV). Here is a shining example of choosing to be thankful, even in the worst of situations.

In the best of situations, there are those who skip the gratitude and go about their busy lives. Back when Jesus healed ten lepers of a painful and highly contagious disease, a disease that kept an afflicted person far from acceptance in normal society, only one in ten of those lepers chose to be thankful; the Samaritan. While the other nine showed faith by obeying Jesus and showing themselves to the priests, they did not run back to thank God like the Samaritan did. Samaritans were hated by the Jews and considered half-breeds, so this Samaritan leper was considered the lowest of the low. Jesus was particularly sensitive to people of low stature and repeatedly raised the unworthy up to worthy status. The passage in Luke 17 says the Samaritan showed faith by obeying, then fell on his face showing God thankfulness, which is exactly what Jesus wants us to do.

We are to thank God for ALL of his blessings. Every moment in our lives we can be thankful for something. Think about what you can be thankful for today and every day.
