## **HOLY WEEK**

As we are in the last few weeks of the Lenten journey, we look forward to Holy Week, the week before Jesus' arduous suffering, death, and resurrection. He knew very well of this fate and predicted it three times to his disciples.

The Pharisees were feeling the pressure. After Jesus had raised Lazarus from the dead, the Pharisees became uneasy that He was gaining more and more followers. They feared the Romans would come and take away both their temple and their nation...and threaten their very power and authority. They decided it was better for the one man to perish rather than the whole nation, and they sought to arrest and kill Him.

On the day of the Passover Festival Jesus came to town as a king being blessed and revered, fulfilling the scripture, "Do not be afraid Daughter Zion; see, your king is coming, seated on a donkey's colt." This celebration further enraged the Pharisees and to top it off, Jesus told them they were powerless to quiet the crowd; that if they were to be silenced the rocks themselves would take up the singing and celebration.

Later, at supper, as a servant, Jesus washed his disciples feet. Then fulfilling scripture again, he said to them, "He who shared my bread has turned against me." He was speaking of Judas who was already paid to betray Him.

He was speaking to all of us who put worldly things before God. Throughout the rest of the Lenten season, let us ponder what we truly value. Will we settle for wealth and worldly pleasure, or seek the things that bring us closer to eternal life in the Kingdom of God? Because of Jesus' suffering, death and resurrection we are set free. Jesus conquered death by dying and gave us forgiveness and hope of eternal life with Him.

On Ash Wednesday, a daily prayer guide was provided that will carry us through Easter. On April 26 there will be a prayer time held at the church beginning at 9am.

## Support for Restore STL

As the Mission Team developed a final budget for 2025, we decided to provide support to Restore St. Louis (RSL). RSL promotes a network of Christian ministries that desire to show God's love to the poor, widows, orphans, immigrants and refugees of St. Louis. It is under the oversight of New City Fellowship of St. Louis, which is a group of seven ministries, each led by their own board. The ministries are: The Freedom School (Pre-K to 8), Health Connection, Harambee Youth Training, Firm Foundation Tutoring, Workday, Umetulisha (food ministry), and Inside Out Prison Ministry. ## **Big News from South Africa!**

We recently received word from Cricket Meyer regarding exciting developments for Lingomso Ministries. You may remember that we were praying for a new building project Cricket had begun to support the great needs of the community in which she works. Well, February brought exciting developments. As Cricket puts it, "God gave me a very clear NO" regarding a building she had been considering. Instead, God led her to a smaller and less expensive building. With funds already raised she was able to make a cash offer, which was accepted! While waiting on closing on the property, an architect will develop plans for necessary modifications. Over the next months, the building will be renovated and outfitted, with the goal of being ready for the 2026 school year. Cricket says, "this early childhood development center and community center will stand as a beacon of light in the community, reflecting and sharing the love of Jesus with all who enter her doors." There will be a special collection this summer in conjunction with Cricket's visit to St. Paul's on July 13.

### Presidents Day Retreat – February 15 & 16, 2025

The retreat consisted of four worship/teaching sessions, two free time sessions, meals, a snack and a (short) night's sleep. The teaching theme for the camp was "In Focus," and the theme verse for the weekend was Hebrews 12:2.

- Session 1 we talked about seeing Jesus Clearly Who Jesus is and why he matters. Matthew 16:13-16
- Session 2 was about removing our distractions, which encouraged us to be mindful of things that keep us away from Jesus. Luke 10:38-42
- Session 3 on Jesus' call to follow him whole heartedly. Matthew 4:18-22
- Session 4 was fixing our eyes on Jesus and keeping him as the center of our lives. Hebrews 12:1-2

The final challenge for the weekend was to live with Jesus in focus at home, school, and beyond.

The retreat was a very positive experience for all who attended. Students strengthened connections with each other and reconnected to worship. We had an exceptional group of students who were fully engaged throughout the weekend.
