

PASTOR MARC'S DESK

Current Sermon Series: Exodus - God With Us

As we continue our journey through the Book of Exodus, we're stepping into the heart of God's redemption story—a story that ultimately points us to Jesus. These next few weeks are packed with powerful moments of rescue, provision, identity, and grace.





Week 4 – The True Sacrifice

Exodus 12:1–14; 12:29–36; 13:3–16; John 1:29–30

As God delivers Israel through the blood of the Passover lamb, we see a vivid picture of the Lamb of God who takes away our sin.

Week 5 - Freedom

Exodus 13:17–14:31

From the edge of the Red Sea to dry ground, God proves He is the one who delivers completely. He didn't just begin our freedom—He guarantees it.

■ Week 6 – Bread of Life

Exodus 15:22-27; 16:1-32; John 6:32-35

As God provides manna in the wilderness, we're reminded that Jesus is the Bread who satisfies not just for a day—but for eternity.

♦ Week 7 − Water from the Rock

Exodus 17:1-7

In the desert, God provides water from a rock—foreshadowing Jesus, our true Rock, who was struck for our salvation.

Week 8 – Covenant Confirmed

Exodus 19:1–20; 24:3–8

10 Week 9 – The Ten Commandments

Exodus 20:1–17; Matthew 22:37–39

The law shows us who God is—and who we are. But only Jesus can fulfill what the law demands and give us a new heart to follow Him.

Join us each Sunday at 9:30am as we keep walking through Exodus and watching the gospel unfold page by page. These aren't just ancient stories—they are God's Word for us today.

DEACON NEWS

Quarterly Operating Income Update

The Deacons continue to work to more clearly communicate how the funds that support St. Pauls are received and used to support church operations, ministries and missionaries. Providing quarterly updates on church operations is an example of this. There are several reasons for using quarterly operating income updates rather than monthly updates:

- Mission's support is paid to our missionaries quarterly.
- Some giving by individuals is done annually at the end of the previous year. For example, annual giving for 2025 was provided in December 2024.
- Many in our congregation provide additional support over and above pledged amounts throughout the year.

It is also important to recognize that St. Paul's budget, as passed by the congregation at its Annual Meeting, provides guidance to St. Paul's leadership on how the congregation wants us to faithfully steward the funds we receive. Funds are managed toward meeting the budget but should be expected to require adjustments during the year based on how actual revenue and expense vary. The June 2025 quarterly update follows.

Church operating receipts and expenses for the first half of 2025 were:

- 2025 General Fund Budget approved by the congregation (full year) \$640,656
- Receipts for General Fund YTD (January-June) \$271,923
- General Fund Expenses YTD (January-June)- \$329,887
- Difference YTD (\$57,964)

Race For Reconciliation

The energy and excitement in Lucier Park were palpable on the morning of June 14, as 450 registered runners/walkers and numerous volunteers gathered for the annual 5K Race for Reconciliation. The race is held along Delmar Boulevard, historically known as the "Delmar Divide" because of the racial and economic differences in the neighborhoods just north and south of the street. All participants experienced fellowship as we mingled and ran & walked together along the "divide". Two representatives from St. Paul's participated – Pastor Marc as a runner and Joyce Lindstrom as a walker. Marco van Raalten was there as one of the organizers through his work with Together STL.

As we walked/ran, we passed some remnants of the recent tornado, including a large fallen tree and a block of four houses whose roofs were covered with tarps. One apartment complex was optimistically named "Delmar Divine."

How could Joyce have taken the picture of Pastor Marc running if she was walking far behind him? Because he had already passed the turn-around point and was headed back while she had far to go! He placed 31st with a time of 26 minutes and 12 seconds; she placed 210th with a time of 53 minutes and 40 seconds. We each got a "medal" – well, a "plastic."

For the 450+ of us who participated, it was a step toward getting out of our racial silos and building community. Consider joining us next year! You'll be glad you did.

Please consider adding your talents and a servant's heart to our list of Helping Hands volunteers.


